We are called to participate in God’s mission of redemption and restoration both individually and corporately as a Church Family. When it comes to giving of oneself financially, here are various ways to do just that.

Automatic Deduction (ACH)

By far the easiest and most consistent way to manage your giving, you can set up an electronic withdrawal directly from your financial institution to the church on a recurring basis. As you can imagine, this is our preferred method for you to use.

- It’s simple. Set it up once, and you’re done.
- It saves the church money. Not only is it paperless, it doesn’t cost us credit card fees or staff time for processing.
- Many people find this method helpful for their own budgeting and tithing purposes, and it helps make giving a priority.
- Predictable giving helps church leaders plan and prepare for ministry.

Online

Giving through our website at fpco.org/give is one of the fastest ways to contribute and is available 24/7 on any device. Simply fill out the online form and you can schedule single or recurring gifts to the church through a debit or credit card. This method of giving only takes a few moments and allows you to give as either a guest or create an account. You can also elect to cover the processing fees to help cover that expense.
